Nurse Update: Sunny Days Ahead

Did you know that the sun’s ultraviolet (UV) rays can start to damage skin in about 15 minutes? To protect your skin, apply a broad spectrum sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15 on all exposed areas before you go outside. Reapply sunscreen every two hours (more often if in the water) and check to make sure that it is within the expiration date. It is important to apply sunscreen even on cool or cloudy days. Other ways to protect skin include staying in the shade, and wearing protective clothing, sunglasses and a hat. Have a safe and healthy summer!!
