As such, FCA is free from many of the mandates and layers of bureaucracy which are hallmarks of public education. In addition, and we believe most importantly, FCA is free to teach a curriculum richly steeped in Biblical worldview void of the secular ideas currently permeating society. However, as a chartered non-public school, FCA must meet certain state requirements, especially those revolving around graduation. Very quickly after school buildings were forced to close in March, the Ohio Department of Education began lifting many traditional requirements including spring testing requirements, attendance requirements, and graduation requirements. **FCA is very pleased to let you know that we did not need to lower or lessen state requirements for graduation.** We were able to switch to distance learning, maintain our published school calendar, and all forty-four seniors will leave FCA having met all of the traditional (pre-closure) state requirements for graduation.
